- All Modern Dance Group classes performers may only appear twice in any of the Modern Dance Group classes
- MD3 Group Modern Dance This class is now changed to Up to Year 13 and not Year 11 & Over
- Special Vocal Solo Classes All six Adult Special Vocal Solo classes, where the best six voices qualify for the Cleveland Medal Test, will now be on the Tuesday afternoon of the Festival so that all performers will know on the same day who has qualified
- Adult Quartet Classes the previous quartet classes have been amalgamated
  for the 2025 festival into one class SG12 Quartet any combination of voices.
  No quartet may appear more than once in this class, but individual performers
  may appear more than once in this class as long as the same four performers
  don't appear altogether in more than one entry.
- Contemporary Manx Classes for Years 3 to 6, and Years 7 to 10 Choose
  one piece from the chosen set pieces for each class.
- PLEASE READ RULES AND CLASS DESCRIPTIONS CAREFULLY TO ENSURE YOUR ENTRIES FULLY COMPLY. Some rules, class descriptions and time limits have changed from previous years.

### **Cranmer Prayer Book Reading Competition**

The **Cranmer Prayer Book Reading Competition** is an annual competition open to any Junior performer in the following age categories:

- a) Age 11 but not yet 15 on 1st February 2026\*
- b) Age 15 but not yet 19 on 1st February 2026\*

The winner of the 2025 Cranmer Award held during our Festival will go onto compete in the National Finals in

Hampton Court Palace, London in 28th February 2026

\*Ages for categories are based on the performer's age on the 1st February 2026. Therefore, a performer aged 10 in 2025 may enter (a) as long as they are aged 11 on the 1st February 2026 and a performer aged 14 in 2025 may enter (b) as long as they are aged 15 on the 1st February 2026. Performer's DOB must be stated on the entry form.

# COMPETITION RULES APPLICABLE TO ALL CLASSES

- 1. All entries shall be made to the Entries Secretary, either online or on the printed forms supplied, on or **before Saturday 1st February 2025**. No late or un-named entries will be allowed. No entry will be accepted unless accompanied by the entry fee.
- You must include the approximate number of people performing in groups, choirs and bands for fire regulations and for the provision of sufficient chaperone tickets, where applicable.
- 3. (a) **No performer** may **appear twice** in the same class **except** in Classes C1, C2, C3, C4, S19, SG4, SG10, B10 B12, all the Piano duet classes, and all MD, CD and FD classes.

(b) No performer may appear **more than twice** in all MD, CD and FD classes.

- 4. In case there is only one performer in any class, such performer shall be entitled to compete and take a prize provided that the Adjudicator considers that the performance is of sufficient merit.
- 5. The Adjudicator's decision as to merit will be final.
- The winners of the trophies are required to sign the record card for that trophy and to return such trophies to Morrison Photos, 54 Buck's Road, Douglas, IM1 1BF polished, engraved and in good condition, not later than the 22nd March 2025.
- No performer is allowed to speak to an Adjudicator immediately before or during the competition. Communications for the Adjudicator must be made through the Festival Secretary.
- 8. Where a time limit has been stated, this will be adhered to strictly. One mark per 30 seconds or part thereof will be deducted if the time limit is exceeded. See **Table of Penalties** for reference.
- 9. The use of any recording equipment including phones, cameras, video, audio etc. is prohibited in the competition rooms, because of copyright legal restrictions, child protection and to avoid disturbing performers. Recording and/or photographing a performer will lead to their disqualification from the class.
- 10. A child under 16 may not enter themselves in the Festival.
- 11. All performances must be suitable for family audiences. See Table of Penalties for use of inappropriate language and/or content.
- 12. Backing tracks may be used in classes where this is stated in the class description. Please check the class description before sending in a backing track. Backing tracks must be supplied to the Entries Secretary no later than the 31st March 2025. Backing tracks can be submitted via USB or online via WeTransfer [theguild.wetransfer.com]. Failure to supply a backing track by the stated date will result in an entry being disallowed.
- 13. No marks will be read out in any class Junior, Adult or Open. The top six performers, qualifying for The Cleveland Medal Test, in the Special Solo classes will be announced following completion of the classes on the Tuesday afternoon.
- 14. Only chairs, props or stools provided by the Festival and The Villa Marina will be permitted on stage, except use of wheelchairs or walking frames/walkers. No sharp objects are permitted on any of the stages at any time during The Festival.

**Note**: Teachers, parents and performers should always be aware of their responsibilities when entering a performer with additional needs, bearing in mind the limitations imposed by the stage and surrounding environment. Such information should be passed on to the Festival Secretary or Entries Secretary on the entry form. The Secretaries will assist where possible to enable a performer to access the stage/provide seating etc; during the relevant class/es and will, where deemed necessary, inform the adjudicator.

### **RULES FOR MUSIC CLASSES**

- 1. (a) Choirs, bands and groups must be composed of bona fide members only. Bona fide members must have been in their respective choirs, bands or groups for at least three calendar months prior to the Festival.
  - (b) Up to four members of a band may be members of other bands competing in the same class applicable to classes B10, B11 and B12.
- 2. Adult Vocal Test pieces **MUST** be sung in the stated key and **MAY** be sung in the original language.

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- All run-throughs with the official accompanist must be arranged by the performer. Any request received within two weeks of the Festival may be refused by the relevant accompanist.
- 4. The official accompanist **MUST** be used in Classes JS1 to JS9, S1 to S9, S12, S14, S15, and S21 and for the Sheffield Plate and Cleveland Medal competitions.
- Use of an official accompanist may also be requested for Classes B1 to B4, R1 to R5, W1 to W3, SC1 to SC5, JS11, JS12, S10, S13a) & b), F1 to F3, SG1 to SG7, JSG1, JSG2, S16, S17, S18 and S20. You must request the official accompanist with your entry.
- 6. In the case of the Junior classes run-throughs with the official accompanist may be arranged at mutual convenience and at the performer's expense.
- 7. Performers who use words and/or music in Solo or Duet singing classes (except Class S8) will be subject to a penalty. See **Table of Penalties** for reference.
- 8. If a performer is entered into a class which is delineated by grade they cannot then enter a different grade class for the same instrument i.e. if entering Class P6 Piano Solo (Grades 1 & 2) a performer cannot then enter classes P10, P10(a), P11, P12, or P15.
- Performers who decide, for unavoidable reasons, to withdraw should inform both the Entries Secretary and (if applicable) their accompanist as soon as possible before the class.
- 10. Entries will **NOT** be accepted without full details including titles, composers, key and duration of piece being shown on the entry form.
- 11. No performer will be permitted to change the piece after the entry form has been received.
- 12. Performers may not choose a piece which has been specified for other classes.
- 13. Own choice music must be submitted with the entry form **only** if the official accompanist is requested.
- 14. In classes where an official accompanist is requested a copy of the entered piece must be included with the entry form, otherwise this service will not be available. Copies must be marked clearly with the name and telephone number of the performer plus class and page number. Performers should contact the relevant accompanist for their chosen class to find how to prepare the copy for them e.g. booklet format etc; Any music being submitted in an inappropriate or poor condition may be returned and the performer asked to submit it again by the closing date for entries. See Copyright Rules. Online entrants should also send their music to the Entries Secretary, 50 Seafield Close, Birch Hill, Onchan, IM3 3BU, by the closing date for entries.
- 15. A copy of the piece for the Adjudicator must be made available at the time of the competition, clearly marked with the performer's name, class and page number.
- 16. Performers in classes P4, P8, P13 and P21 may appear twice in their chosen class as long as they are performing a different piece and are swapping positions i.e. two performers may appear together with one playing right hand and the other playing left hand; they can then swap over to play a different piece swapping hands.
- 17. Performers must not appear with their teacher or a person not currently studying the same piano grade in Piano Duet classes P4, P8, P13 or P21 or class P24 Piano Ensemble.
- 18. Pieces entered for classes A1(a) and A1(b) **MUST** be the performer's own work and **not** that of another composer, living or deceased.
- 19. Costumes can be worn except in Songs from The Musicals classes where songs chosen are from Musicals which are in current production as these are subject to copyright law, but can be sung without permission as a concert item with no costume or choreographed movement. If sung in costume or using movement then copyright permission is required and must be sought by the entrant or their representative before submitting their entry.
- 20. No quartet may appear more than once in class SG12 Quartet any combination of voices; however, individual performers may appear more than once in this class as long as the same four performers don't appear altogether in more than one entry
- 21. Own choice pieces in classes JS12, \$16 and \$17 must be easily recognisable as pop songs and must have been released by the original artist in the time period stated for the class. Re-releases or re-recordings by other artists in later years are not eligible for the class. Pop songs and popular songs are songs which are intended to be for a wide audience with immediate appeal, but possibly short-lived popularity. All entries will be reviewed to ensure they meet the criteria for the class and performers of any entries that

don't meet the criteria will be contacted by the end of February to change their entry. Failure to change an entry may result in a performance receiving adjudicator remarks only and no marks.

### COPYRIGHT AND PHOTOCOPIES

The Festival is under legal obligation to supply the Performing Rights Society with details of all musical (instrumental and vocal) items performed at the Festival, therefore, the copyright and photocopy rules must be adhered to.

Copies of own choice works for the Adjudicator. Where copyright still exists, the Music Publishers Association has a revised Code of Practice on copying copyright works, and the following concession is made for copying own choice pieces from volumes only for the Adjudicator. Other items must not be photocopied without the permission of the copyright holder in each case.

When an Own Choice work is selected from a publication containing several different works and which is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of an adjudicator at a competition or festival provided that the performer or participant has already purchased his/her own copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the Administrator of the Competition or Festival immediately after the event.

Performers are advised that this permission applies only to copyright holders who are Members of The Music Publishers Association (listed at the back of the Code of Practice leaflet, obtainable from the Association at 103 Kingsway, London, WC2B 6QX). It is the performer's own responsibility to ensure that they seek permission to copy direct from any copyright holder whose name does not appear in the MPA list.

Single copies of items may not be photocopied without the prior permission of the copyright holder.

The permission does not apply to making copies for the Accompanist, who must always be given a printed copy from which to work. Photocopies for the adjudicator must be totally legible, or they may be refused.

The Manx Music, Speech and Dance Festival has entered into an agreement with the Authors' Licensing and Collecting Society. This means that entrants do not have to seek copyright permission for any poetry, prose or solo dramatic items performed, to a time limit of ten minutes. Authors will be directly reimbursed as a consequence of their works being performed at this festival. Dramatic items must be announced with title and author at the time of performance to qualify for copyright indemnity, and the performer must not change the words or gender of the character. Duologues and group dramatic activity are not covered by this agreement, and copyright for these items should be sought by performers at the time of entry.

In order to comply with Copyright rules, all OWN CHOICE entries must include TITLE, AUTHOR, PUBLISHER, and duration of piece or they will NOT be accepted.

### **COMPOSITIONS AND ARRANGEMENTS**

### A1 - Musical Composition

£50 First Prize for both age ranges.

The challenge is to compose a piece of music for a maximum of five performers on **any theme**. Performers are required to arrange a performance of their piece which will follow the adjudication. **Time limit 8 minutes**.

All compositions must be submitted with the entry form or online by **Saturday 1st February 2025**. Recordings of the original composition being entered by any performer must also be sent to the Entries Secretary at 50 Seafield Close, Birch Hill, Onchan, IM3 3BU by Saturday 1st February 2025 [theguild.wetransfer.com]. The format of the recording is at the performer's discretion, but must be playable by the Adjudicator via either use of an app, USB or CD drive. Entries will be judged on the written manuscript only and NOT on the recording. The recording is to be provided to enable the Adjudicator to understand the performer's ideas behind the piece and how it should be performed. For more details contact either the Festival Secretary or the Entries Secretary.

### A2 - Anything Goes (Open)

**Manx Operatic Society Trophy** 

Own choice performance of music and/or dance on any theme. **Time limit 6 minutes**. Rifle mics and backing tracks permitted. Backing tracks to be sent with entries. Marks will not be awarded but an adjudication will be given. If your piece would be better suited to other classes e.g. vocal ensembles, group dance etc; then you should consider carefully, which class is the more appropriate to enter.

### A3 - Have a Go! (Open)

A class for complete newcomers of any age or ability who have never previously performed in any class at The Festival before. Perform a solo song, drama piece or dance. Time limit 4 minutes.

### A4 - Little Stars (Reception Age Juniors only)

A class for Reception-age Juniors of any ability. Perform a solo song, drama piece or dance of your choice. Time limit 2 minutes. Performers must already be in Reception and not awaiting to start in the school year following the Festival. This class is non-competitive as it's about introducing our talented youngsters to The Festival. All performers will receive a certificate for taking part.

### **VOCAL CLASSES - JUNIOR CHOIRS**

**The Vancouver Shield** will be awarded to the choir gaining highest marks in Classes JC1 to JC4.

**Note:** In all Junior Classes, each member of a competing choir must be within the age limit. A copy of the pieces for the Adjudicator must be provided at the time of the competition.

**BL5** - Ballet Solo (Years 11 and over)

**Modern** is an all-inclusive term applied to an ever-evolving performing art. It includes lyrical modern, jazz, stage, contemporary, hip-hop and all styles of modern theatre dance. Acrobatic, gymnastic and street dance are acceptable only when combined with strong dance technique. Time limit 4 minutes. Minimum 5 performers.

**Character** is a dramatic and sometimes humorous presentation of either a story from any book, play, film, cartoon etc, or historical characters or the mannerisms and essential features of a person, animal, bird, reptile, insect, etc. Performers are permitted to interpret the words of a song or spoken word. Classical Ballet is the traditional dance technique used in Character, although any dance technique is acceptable. Time limit 2 minutes.

- **CD3 Character Dance Duet (Open)**

**Tap** dance is a form of dance in which the rhythm or rhythmical variation is audibly tapped out by the dancer with the toe or heel of shoes which are specially adapted to make the sounds. Time limit 2 minutes.

AD1 - Group Dance (Adult)

Any genre except folk/country/national dance. Time limit 4 minutes. Minimum 5 performers.

### The Leighton Stowell Cup will be awarded to the Group gaining highest marks in Classes FD1 to FD5

The time limit for classes FD1 to FD5 inclusive is 4 minutes

- FD1 Manx Folk Dancing (Up to Year 6). Doris Larsen Cup Minimum four dancers. Own choice. Title of dance must be on entry form.
- FD2 Manx Folk Dancing (Years 7 to 13) Perree Bane Cup Minimum four dancers. Own choice. Title of dance must be on entry form.
- FD3 Country/National Dancing (Up to Year 6) Sharon Rye Cup Minimum three couples. Own choice. Title of dance must be on entry form.
- FD4 Country/National Dancing (Years 7 to 13) Sheila Corkhill Memorial Cup Minimum three couples. Own choice. Title of dance must be on entry form.
- FD5 Morris or Sword Dancing (Open)
  Group or individual. Own choice. Title of dance must be on entry form.
- **FD6 Country/National Dancing (Adult)**Shirley Savage Salver
  Minimum 6 dancers. Own choice programme. Time limit 8 minutes. Title of programme **must** be on entry form.

The winner will be nominated by the adjudicators and will have the opportunity to attend a short course or summer school or to use an equivalent sum for tuition on-Island up to a value of £1,000. The scholarships will be awarded each year in rotation between Drama, Music, Dance and Singing. The Festival scholarship will be awarded to a performer in the age range 12 to 25.

**THE HEATHER NICHOLL AWARD** of a Silver Salver and Scholarship of £100 will be awarded to the Performer aged 18 or under considered to be the best all-round performer in music.

THE DOUGLAS BUXTON SCHOLARSHIP of £100 to be awarded to the most promising young voice (not necessarily a prize winner) ages 18 and over in class S14 Vocal Solo All Voices 18 to under 26 years.
